

The 1972 football season was an entirely new ballgame at S.M.A. This could be called a "year of changes."






Under the coaching of Lt. Bosiak, Dee Mastroianni was able to have a beautiful season at vuarterback, leading the team on a hard schedule.






Rifle Team



Frank Jarosowiz led the scoring throughout the season averaging 18 points a game. Carlos Iraheta was also an outstanding performer playing his third year on the team.












