

SECTION 11. FIRE REGULATIONS

1. In case of fire, the city fire alarm will be turned in by the person first discovering the fire. The alarm may be given by telephone or from the city fire alarm box located on the wall near the entrance to the Commissary.

2. The Business Manager is designated "Fire Marshall" of the Staunton Military Academy and is responsible for all measures for fire prevention and fire protection. He will determine when a fire drill is to be held and will cause the alarm to be sounded for such drill. He will advise the Commandant of Cadets of the time selected for fire drill.

3. In the absence of the Fire Marshall, the Commandant of Cadets or in the latter's absence, one of his assistants, will assume his duties.

4. The Commandant of Cadets is responsible for the actions and conduct of cadets at fire call and until recall is sounded, regardless of all other regulations. In the absence of the Commandant of Cadets, his duties during a fire drill will fall in succession on: Officer in Charge, Assistants to the Commandant, Senior Barracks Supervisor present, Senior Faculty Officer present, Cadet First Captain, other cadets in order of seniority.

5. In case of fire or fire drill, twenty-five or thirty short rings of the barracks' gongs will be sounded by the sergeant of the guard and the buglers on guard will sound fire call. At this signal, day or night, all companies will be formed at their regular places on the upper asphalt.

6. All companies, in regular formations, will be formed promptly, without noise or confusion, and will be held for further instruction or until the order for dismissal.

7. Cadets will form in the uniform they are wearing at the time of fire call. If not fully dressed, they will clothe themselves as quickly as possible according to weather conditions. Immediate clearing of the barracks is the prime consideration.

8. The Barracks Supervisor is responsible to insure that all cadets are cleared from the barracks at fire call and for the procedure of leaving. He will organize within his barracks from faculty and cadets a "fire detail" to carry out this responsibility.

9. Windows will be closed, doors left unlocked to permit inspection.

10. The guard will form where directed and await instructions. The senior members of the guard in the guard room will at once notify, personally or by telephone, the Commandant and Officer in Charge.
