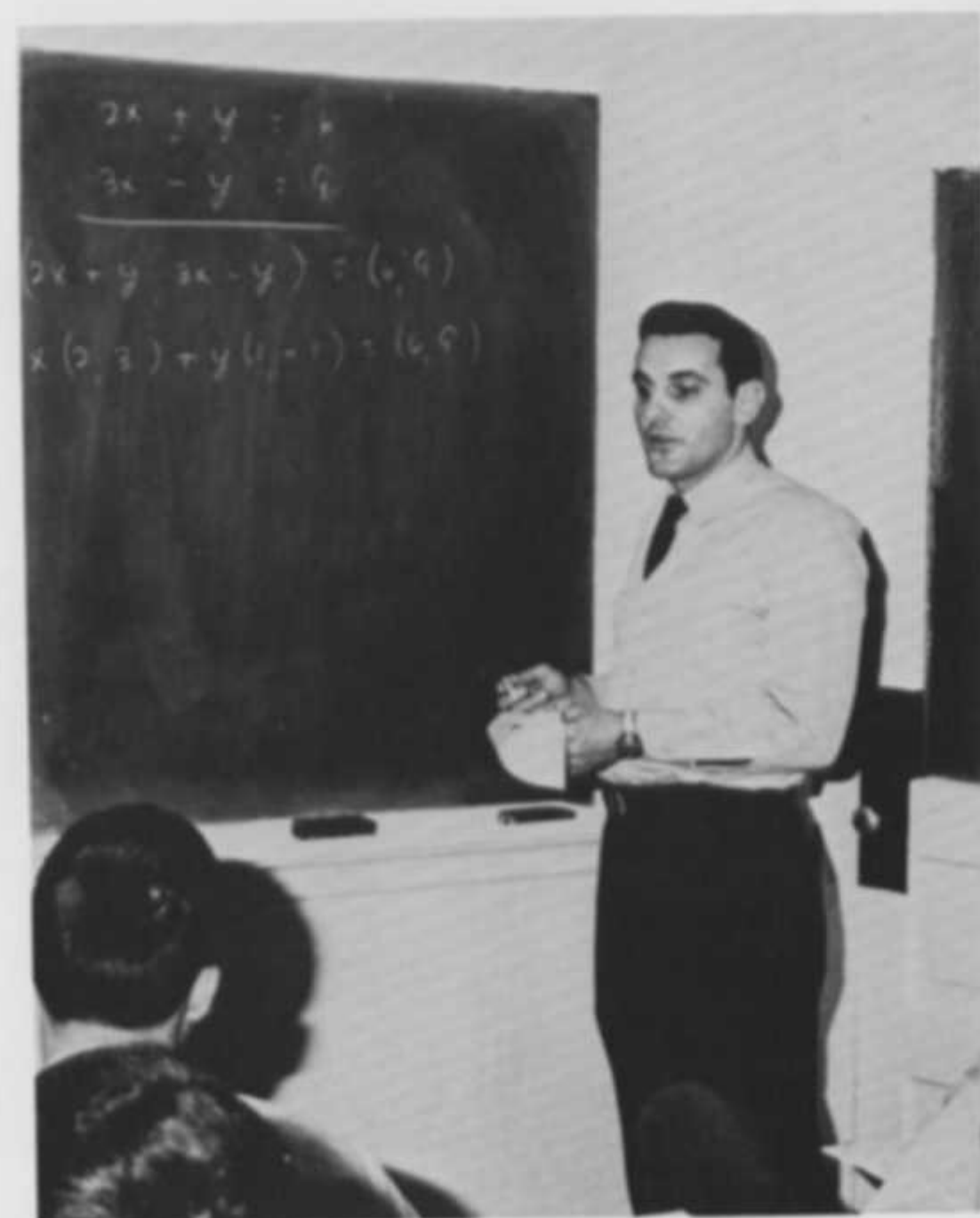

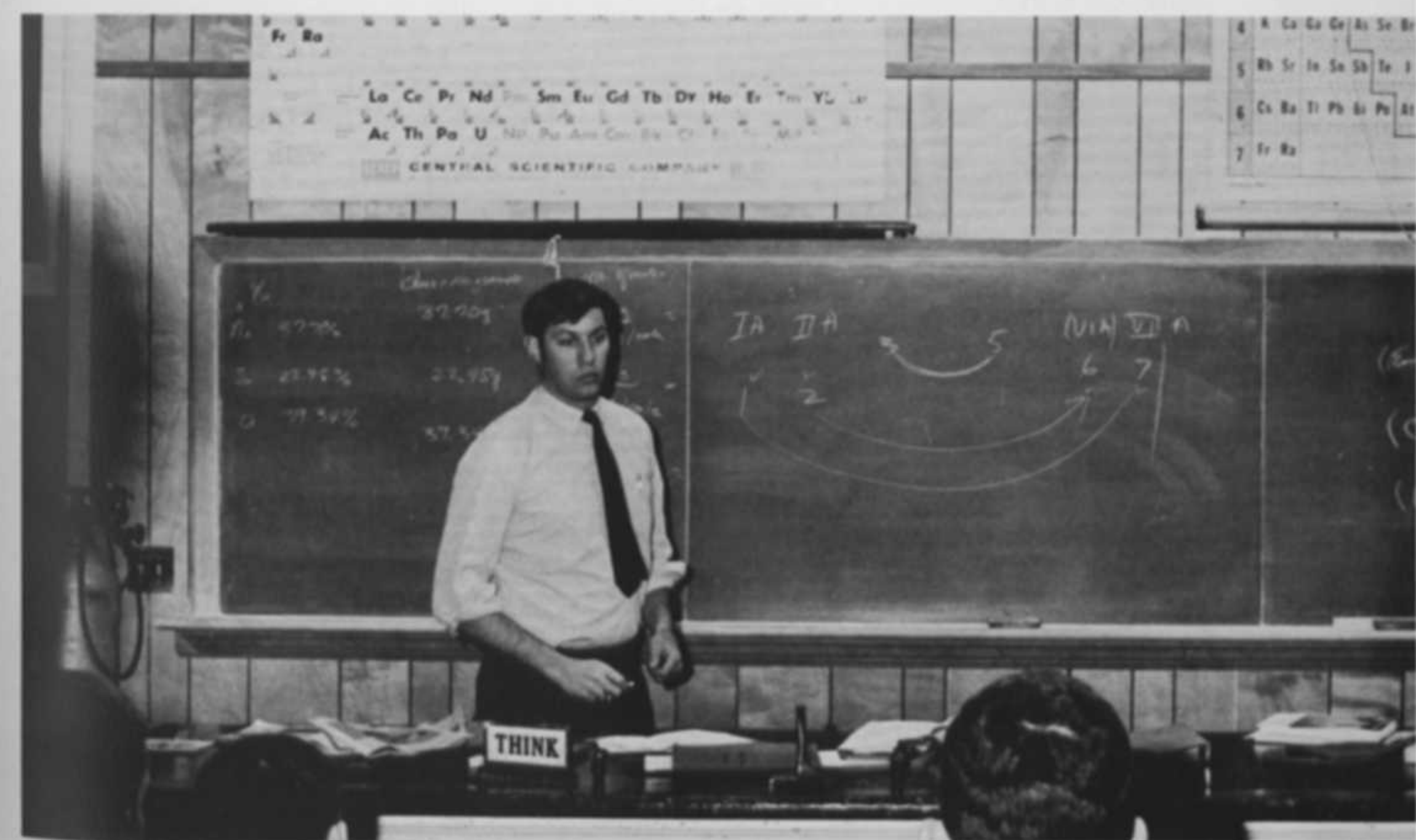

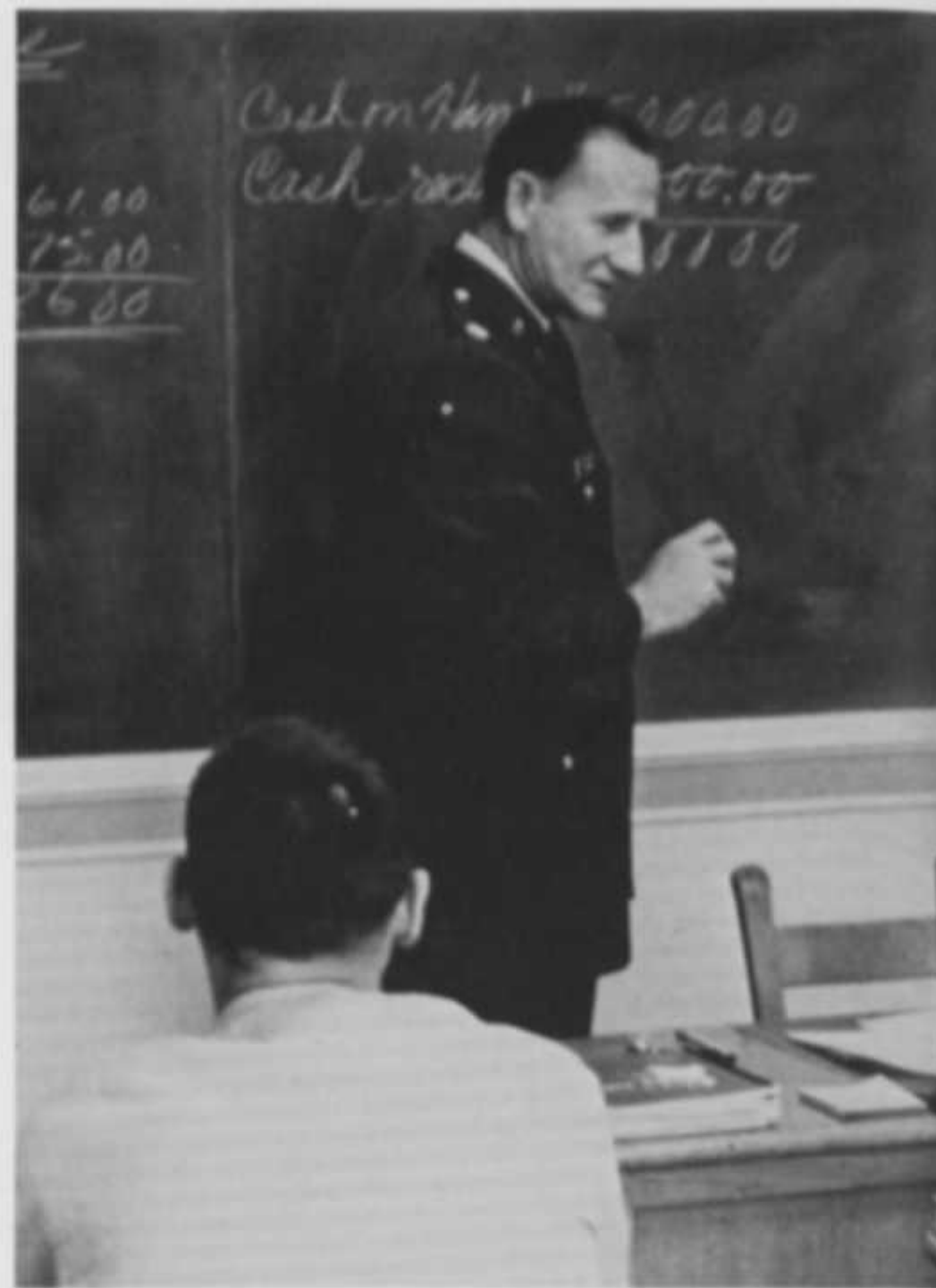

Guard Duty

Cadet Guard Mount is held each day at 1630 hrs. Earlier times are specified for weekends. The cadet Guard consists of an Officer of the Day, a SFC or higher, a Sergeant and a Corporal of the Guard. Five orderlies are also selected; from these a gate guard is chosen. It is his responsibility to direct visitors to the office or person they seek. The O.D. carries the overall maintenance of the Guard. It is his responsibility to write up a delinquency sheet at the end of his tour of duty. He is assisted by the Sgt. of the Guard. The Corporal is in charge of delegating the orderlies on such tasks as collecting absentee reports and tracing people for telephone calls. A first year cadet can expect to pull Guard Duty eight to twelve times during the year.

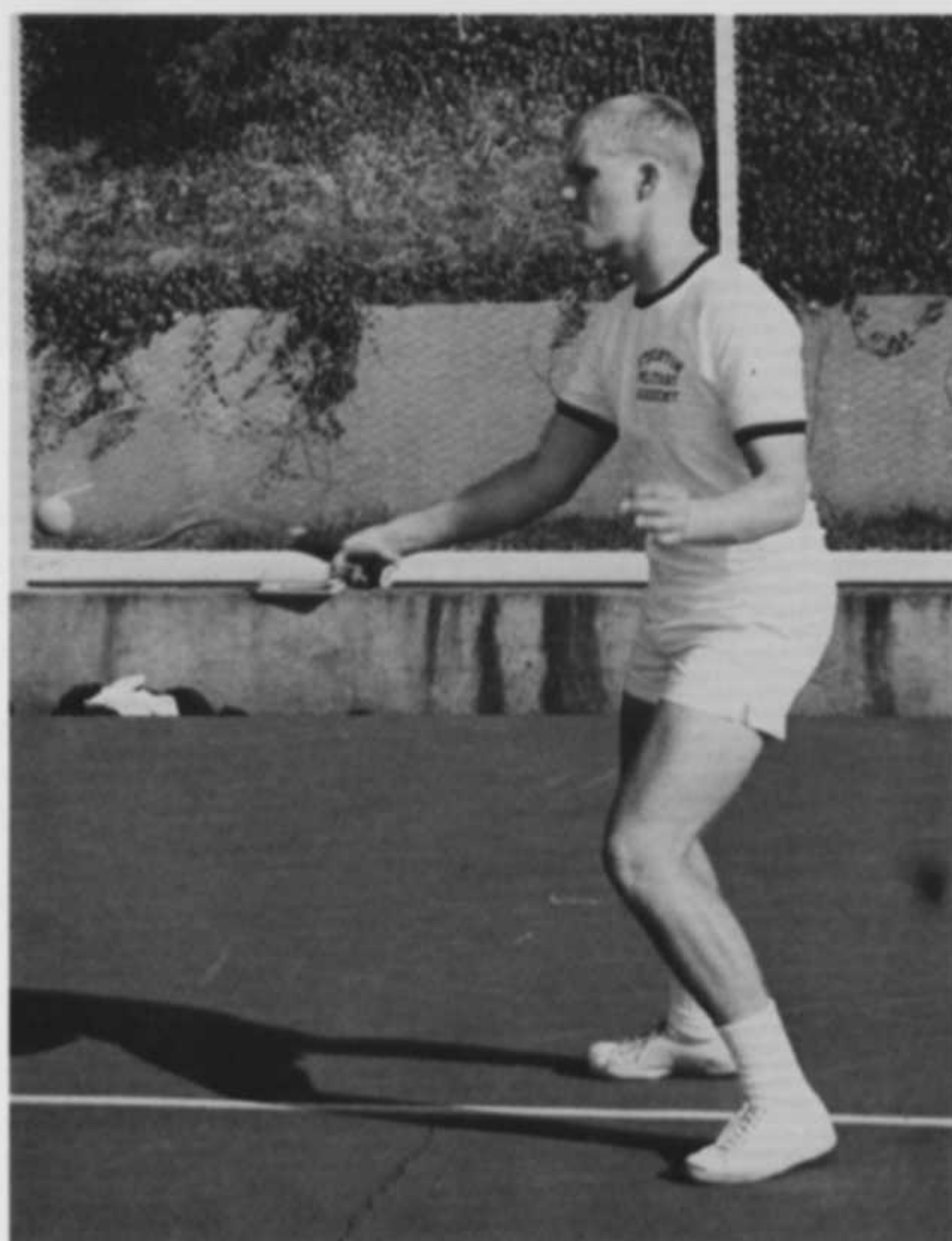

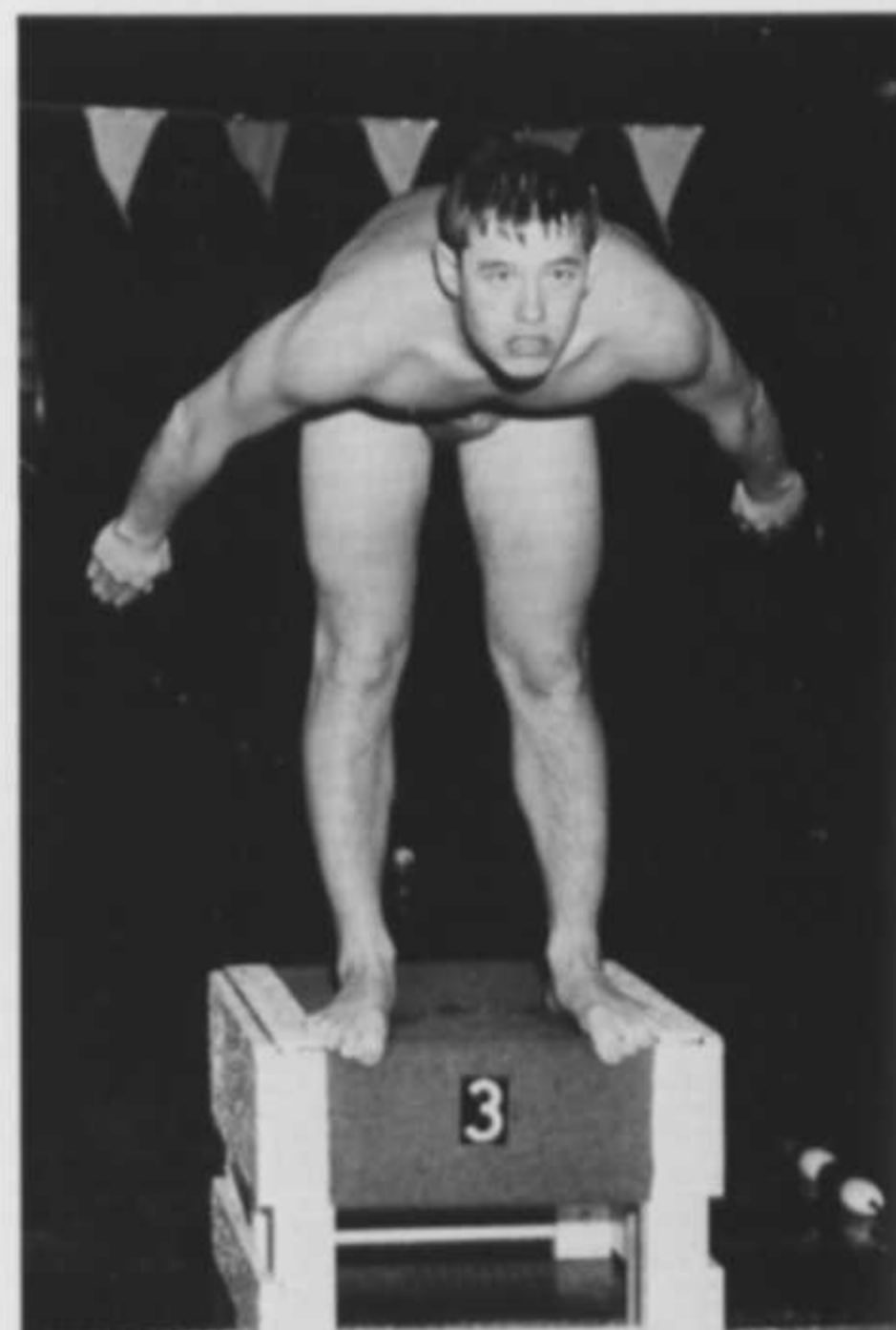

Blue and Gold

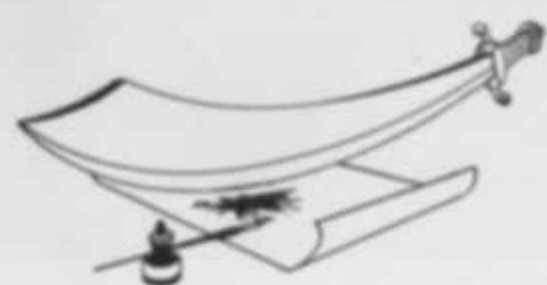

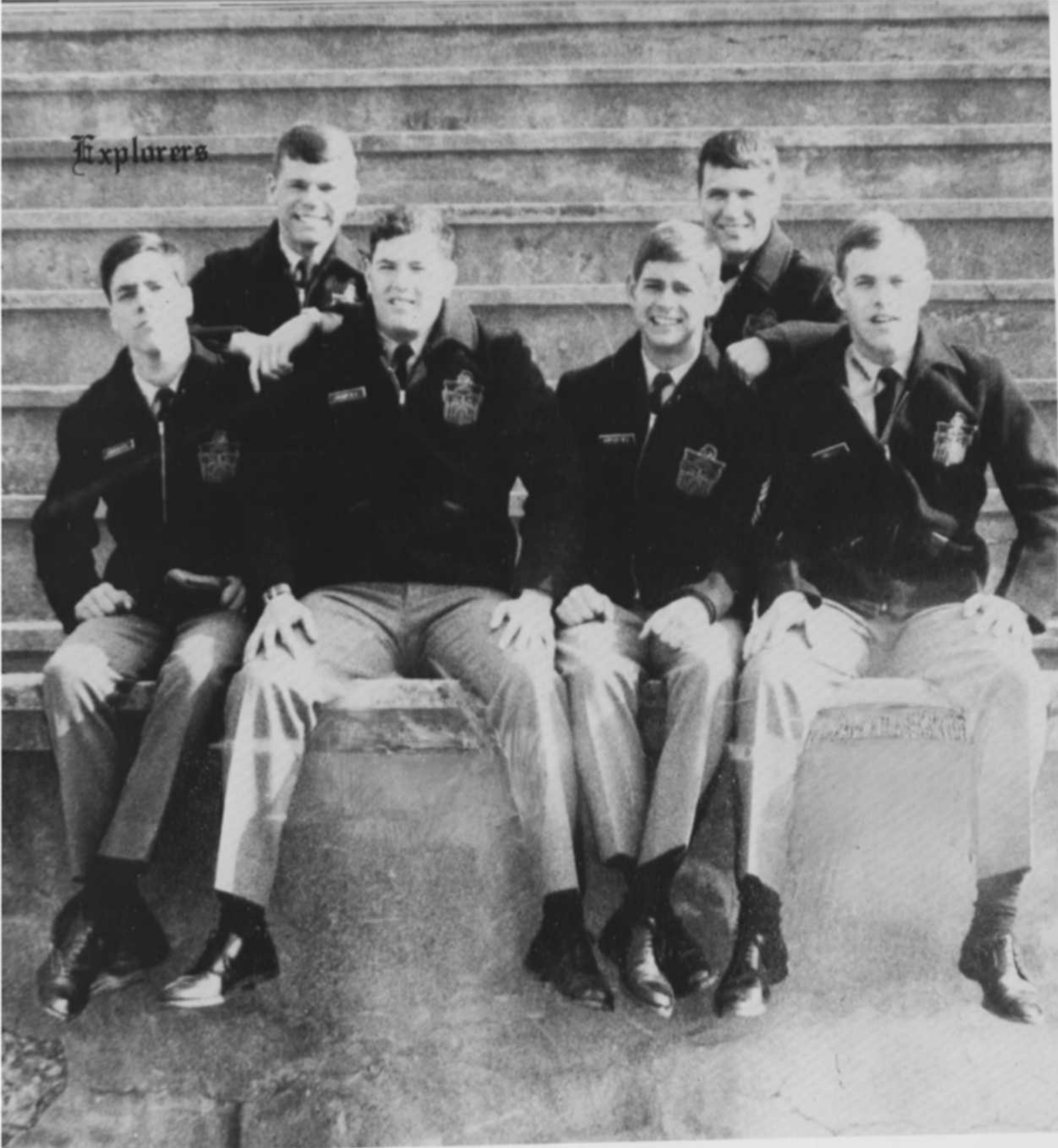

He and Cadet Frank Pavalkis commanded this year's Rangers, separated into two "A" teams. This group of dedicated young men were trained and supervised by Capt. Ned Bonfoey, once a Green Beret himself. Assisting Capt. Bonfoey was S/Sgt. Roy Logue. With these two faculty officers the Rangers achieved a new height in proficiency. Applying what these cadets learned in Military Science class; and what they were taught in the field, the Rangers felt at ease under the combat simulated conditions of numerous Field Training Exercises. Acting as aggressors against Virginia Military Academy's Corps of Cadets or as insurgent forces harassing the National Guard, these cadets proved equal, if not superior. Among the newer subjects covered in training this year was Public Relations. This knowledge came in very useful while the Rangers were operating in the Buffalo Gap area, when rations were assembled from the people of that area and off the land.

Next year's commanders will be Ranger 1Lt. Ray Oden and Ranger 1Lt. Pem Thompson, both presently the Rangers Executive Officers.

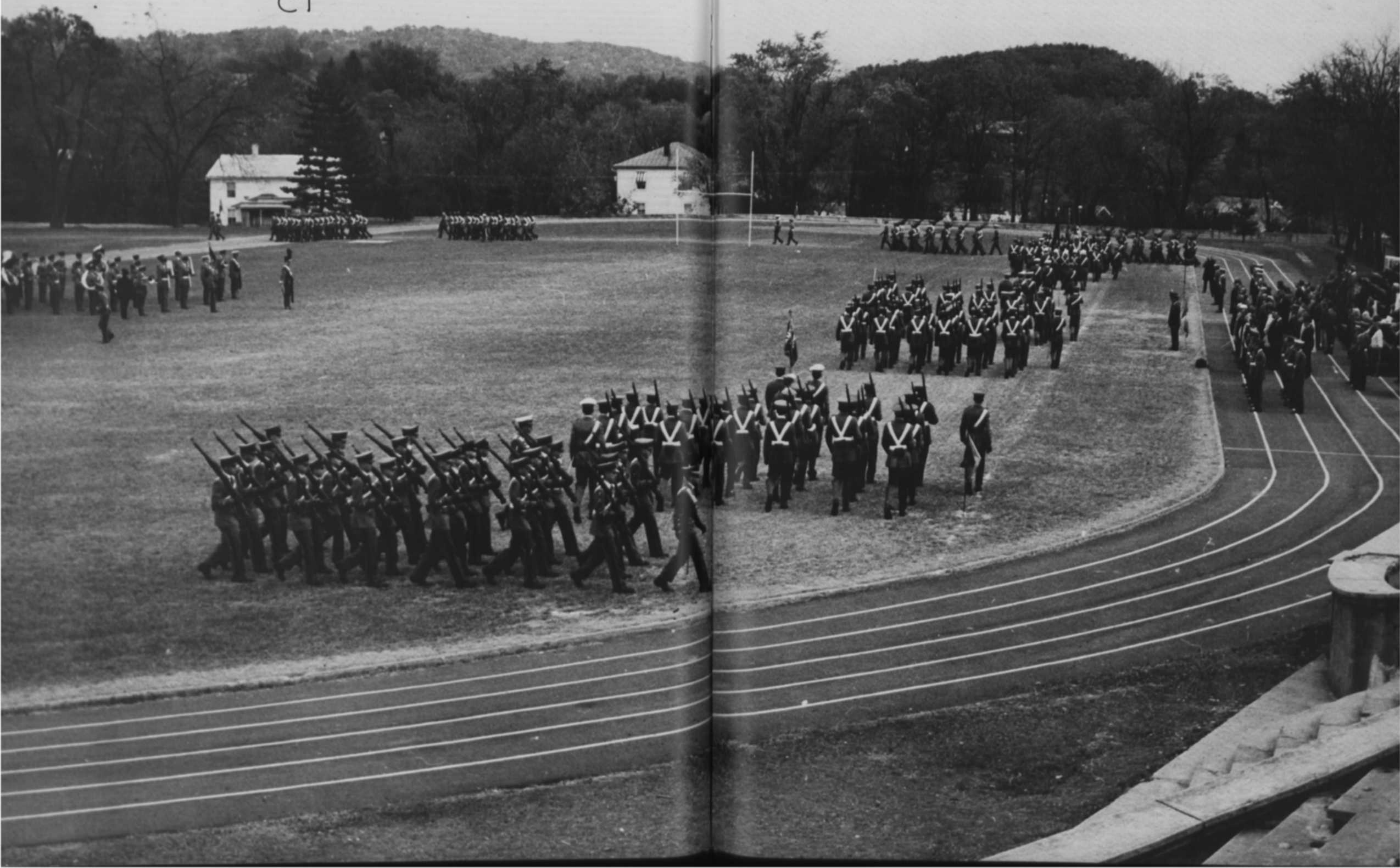

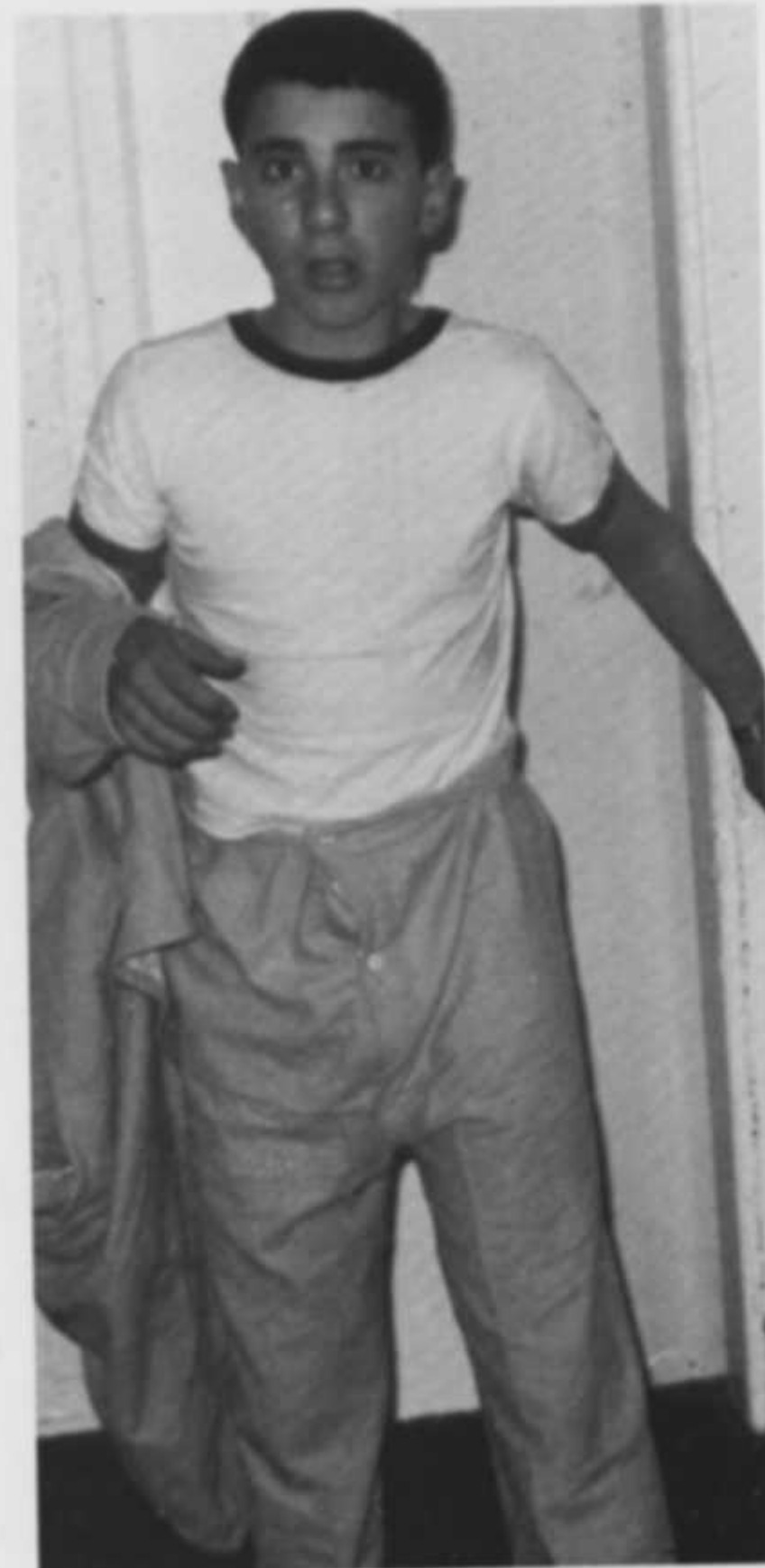
