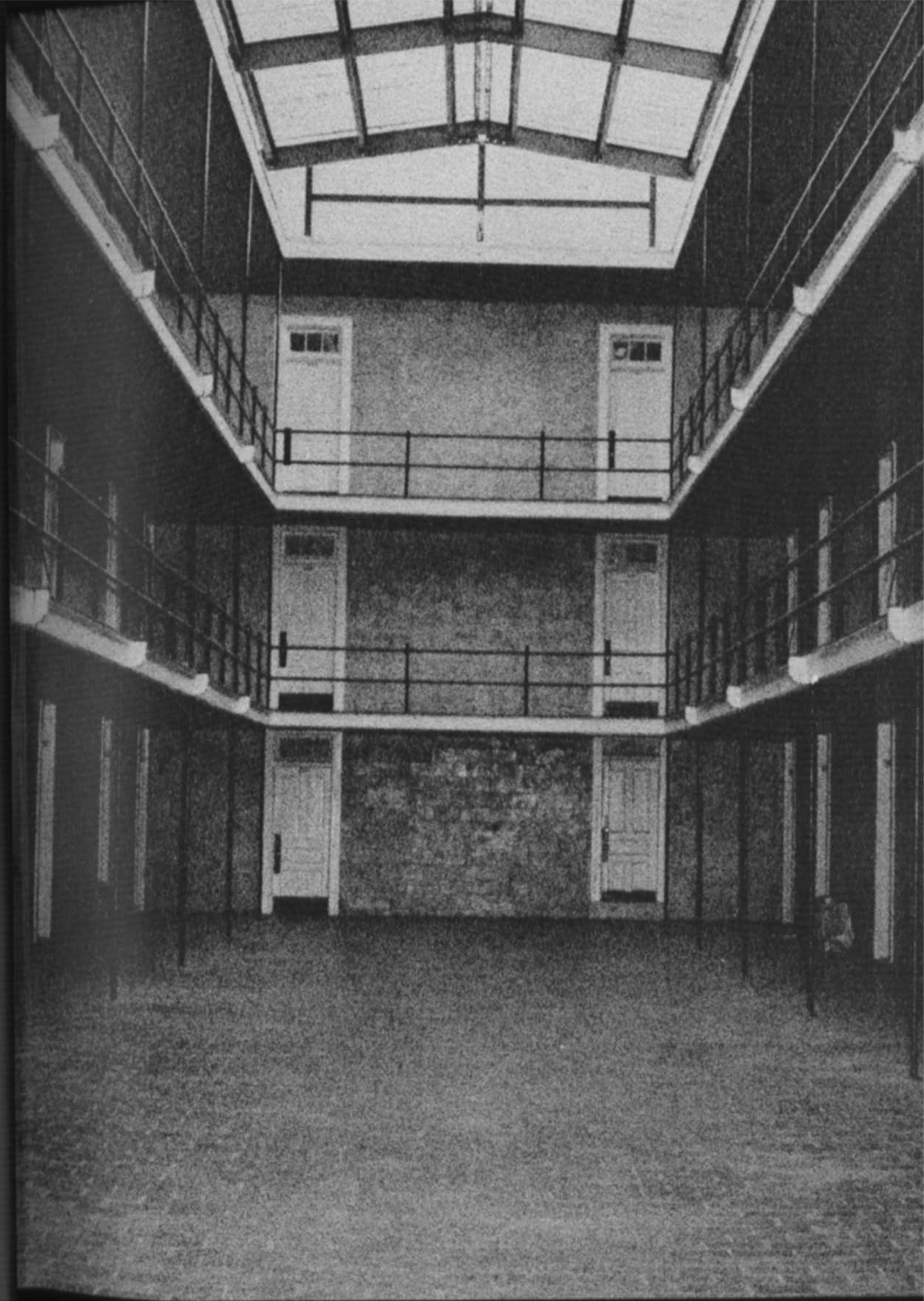

A school is a mingling of buildings and people, old boys and "rats," faculty and students, but most of all it is the mingling of people with people with the resulting flow of thoughts and energy.





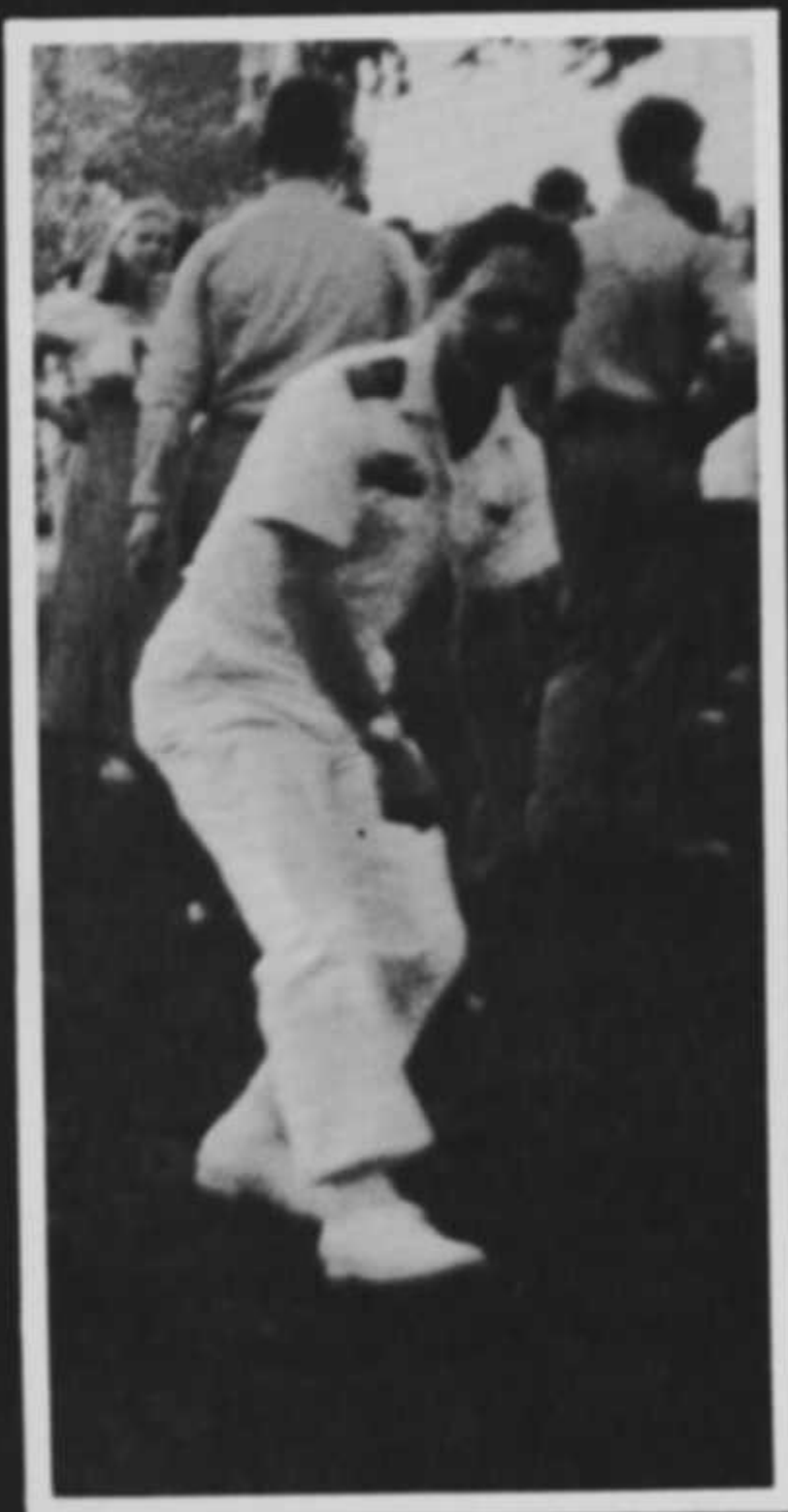
A school is based on a campus with fields and buildings, but these are a mere shell without the spirit and concern of the corp of cadets. A school lives only for and through the members of that school.



All facets of school life are designed to provide the student with those qualities of a well-rounded scholastic experience considered vital to the ideals of the school.







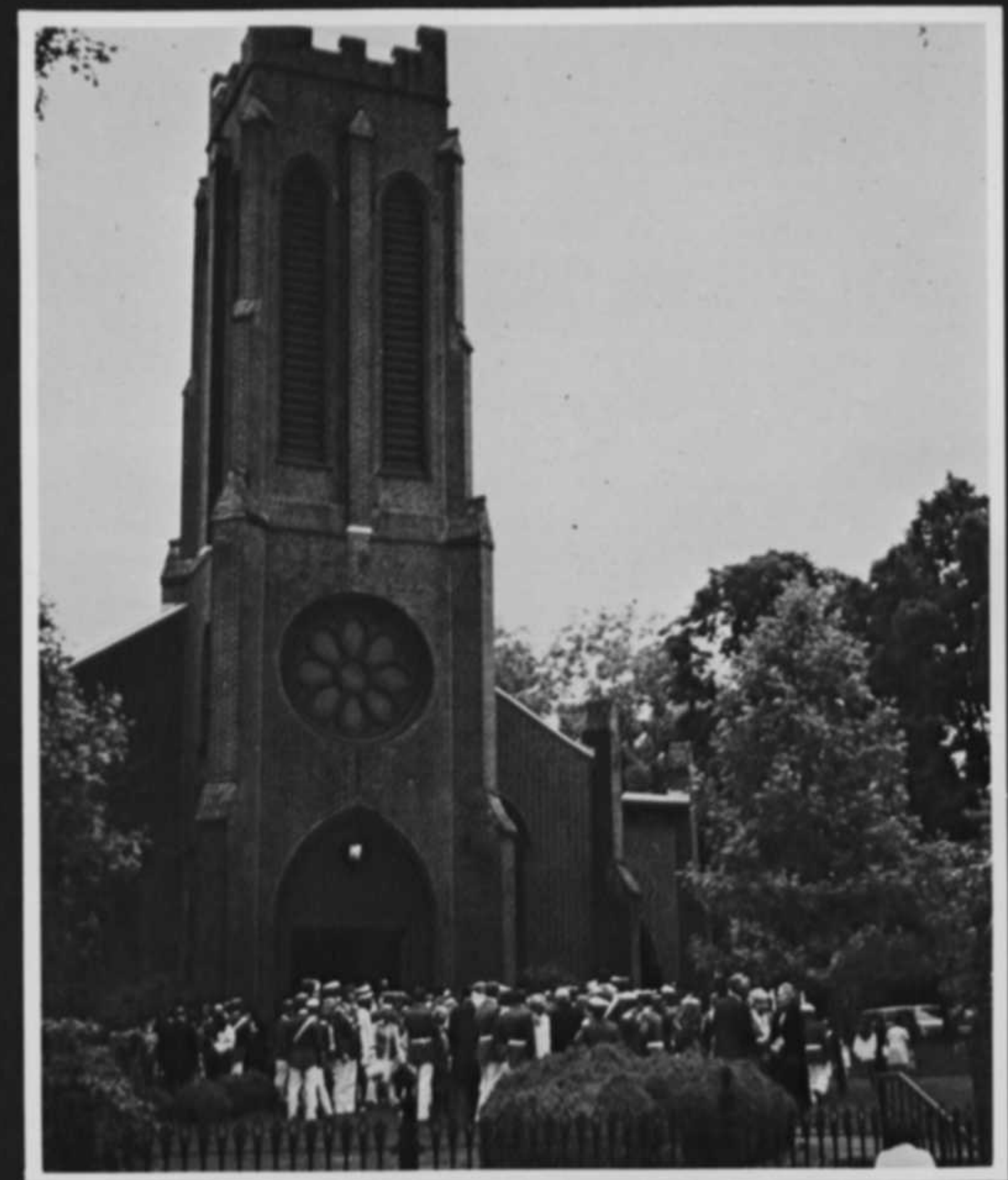

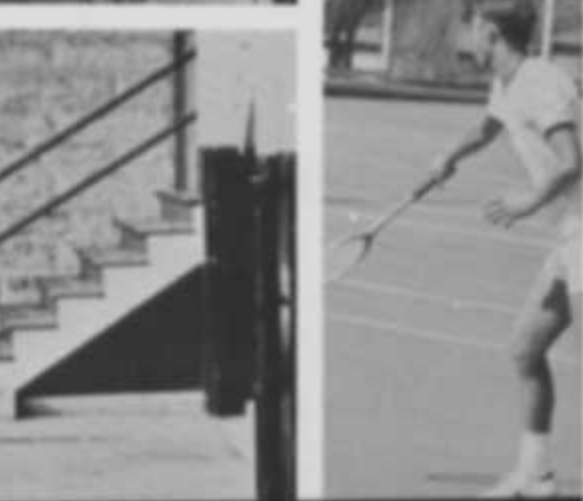
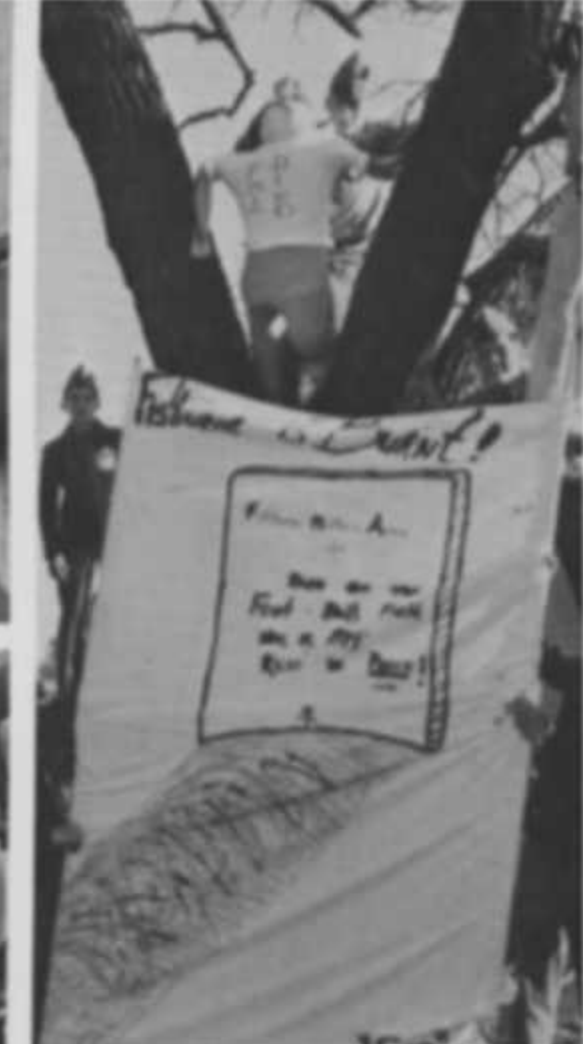
We, therefore, dedicate this book to Staunton Military Academy—to the people, and traditions and pride that have maintained Staunton as an outstanding institution for the last 115 years.

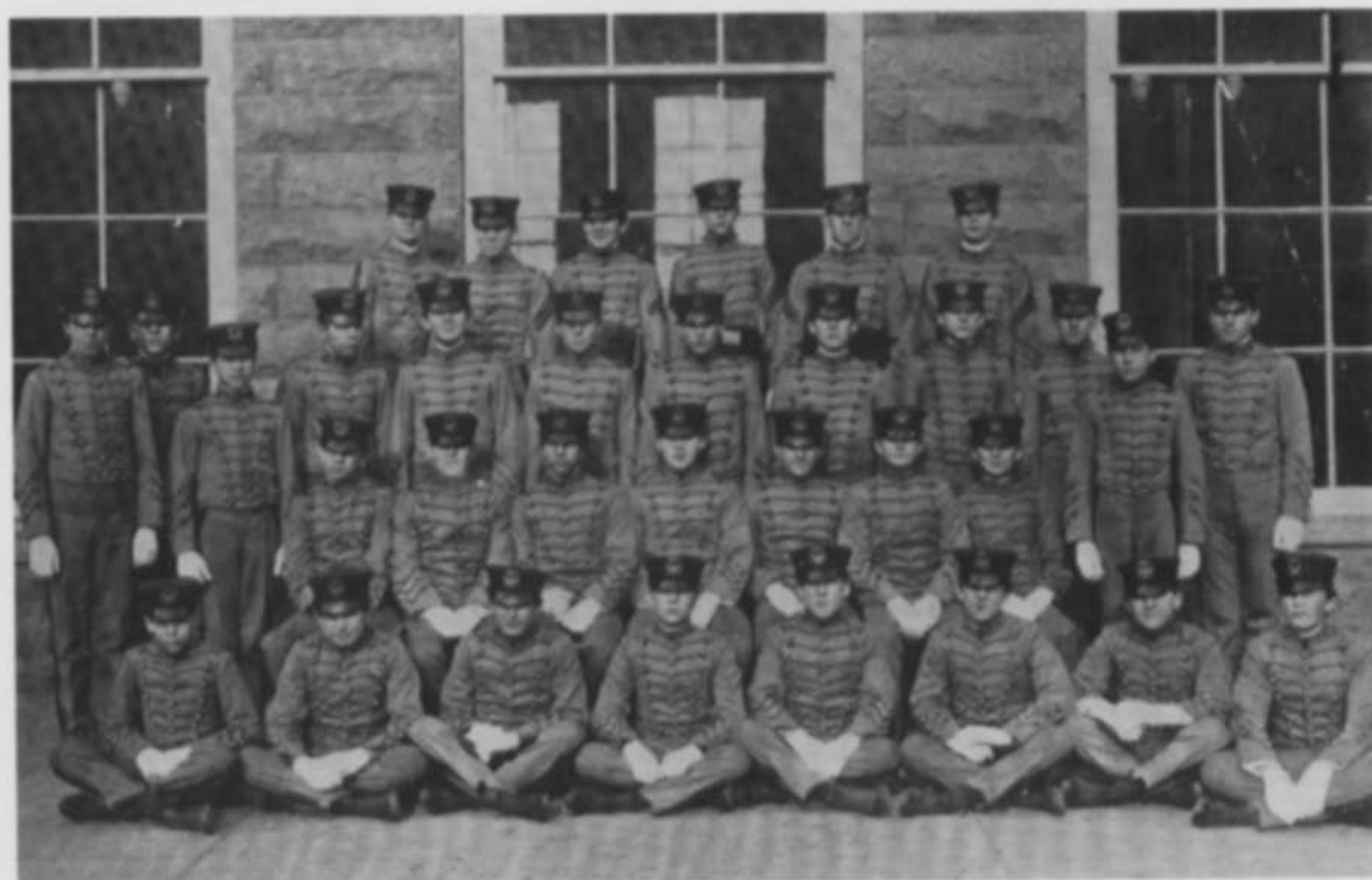

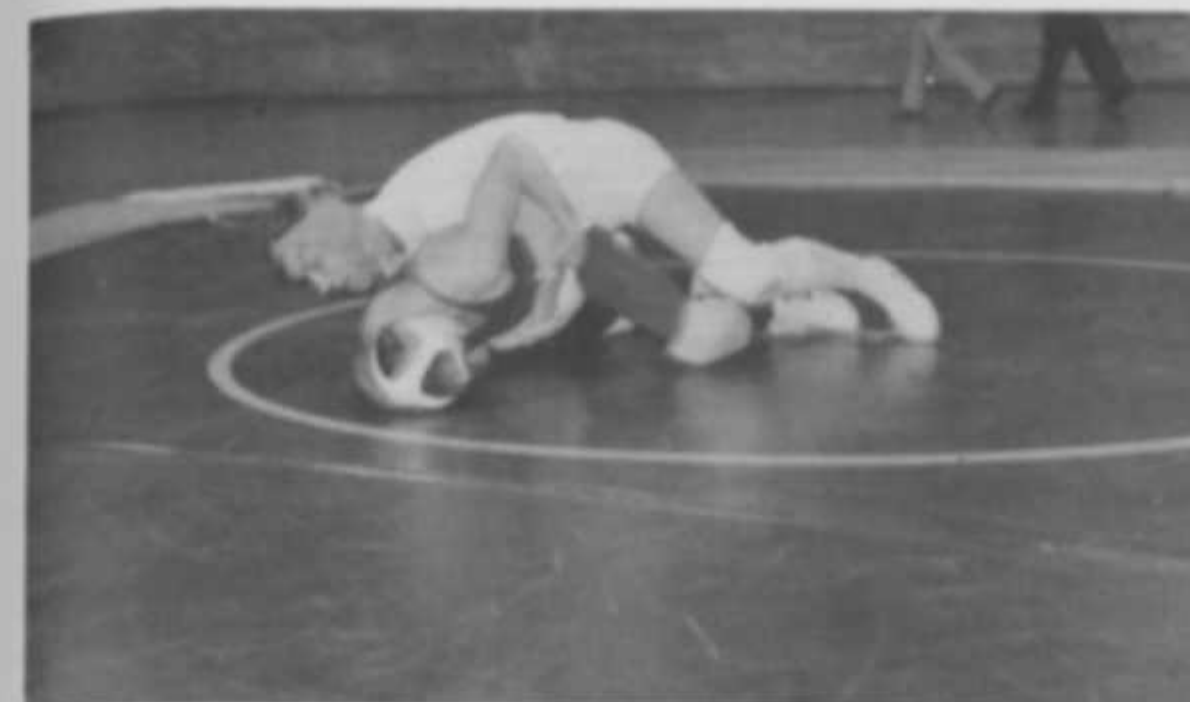

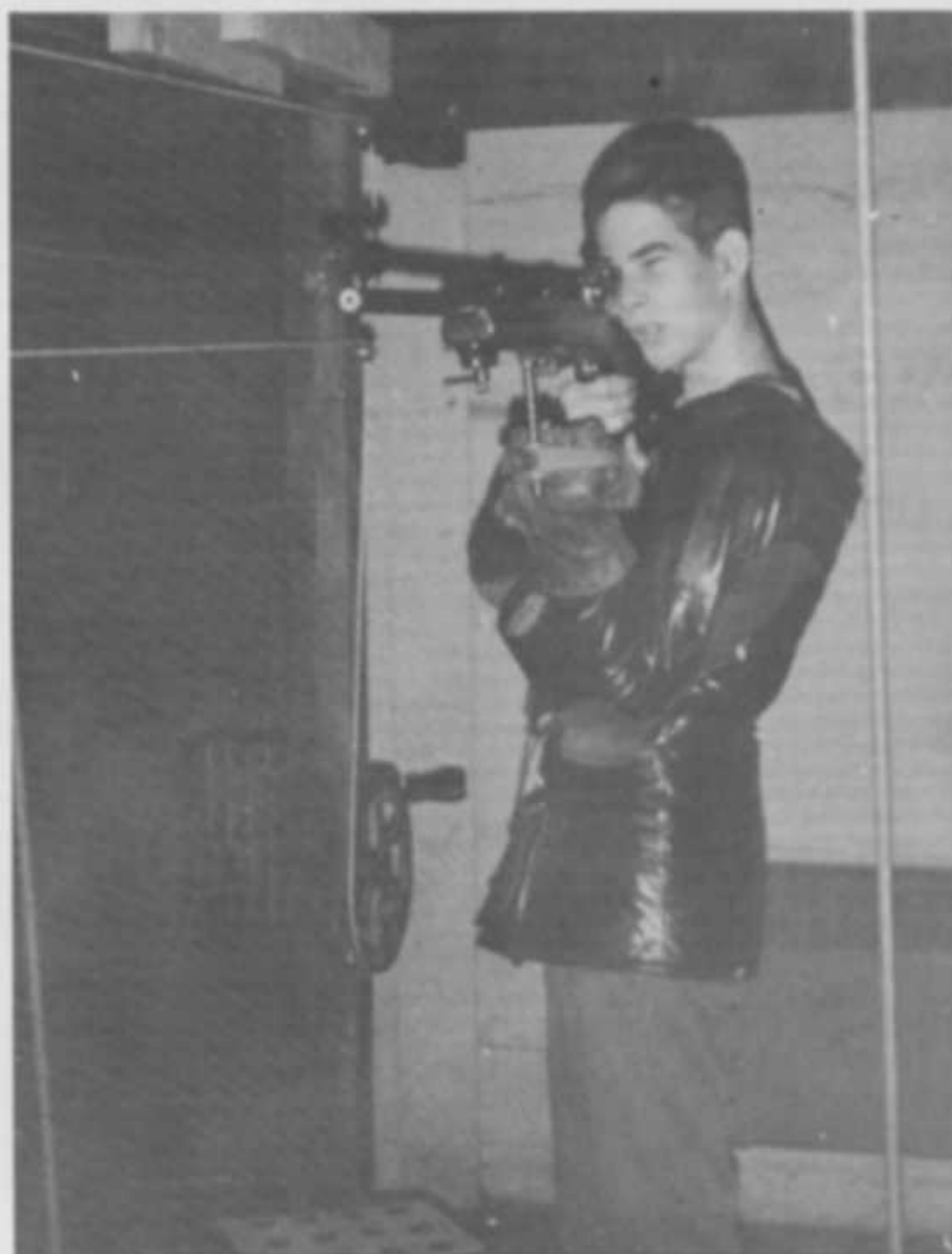

Alpha Society



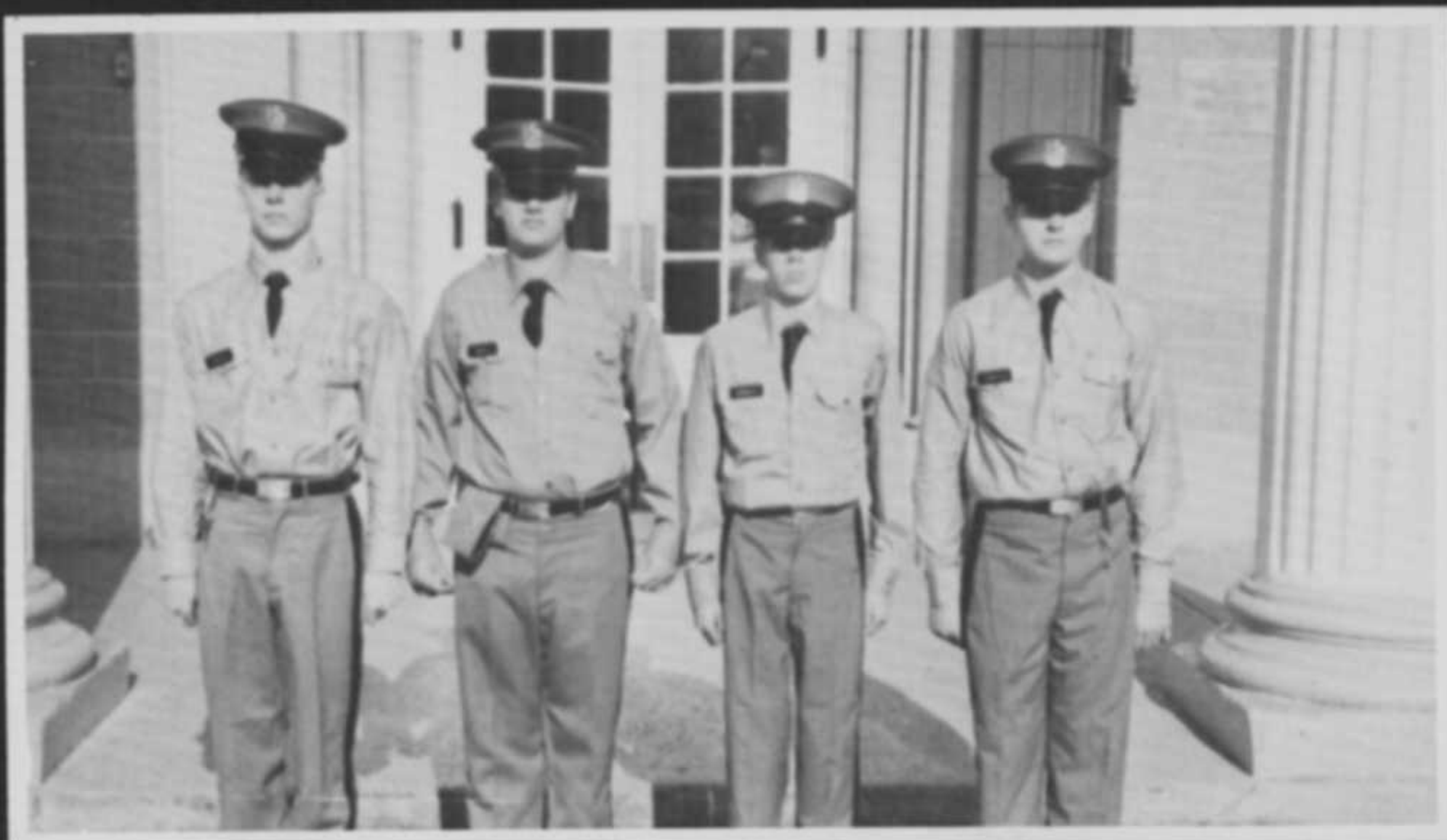

Selections are made twice a year, in the fall and at graduation.

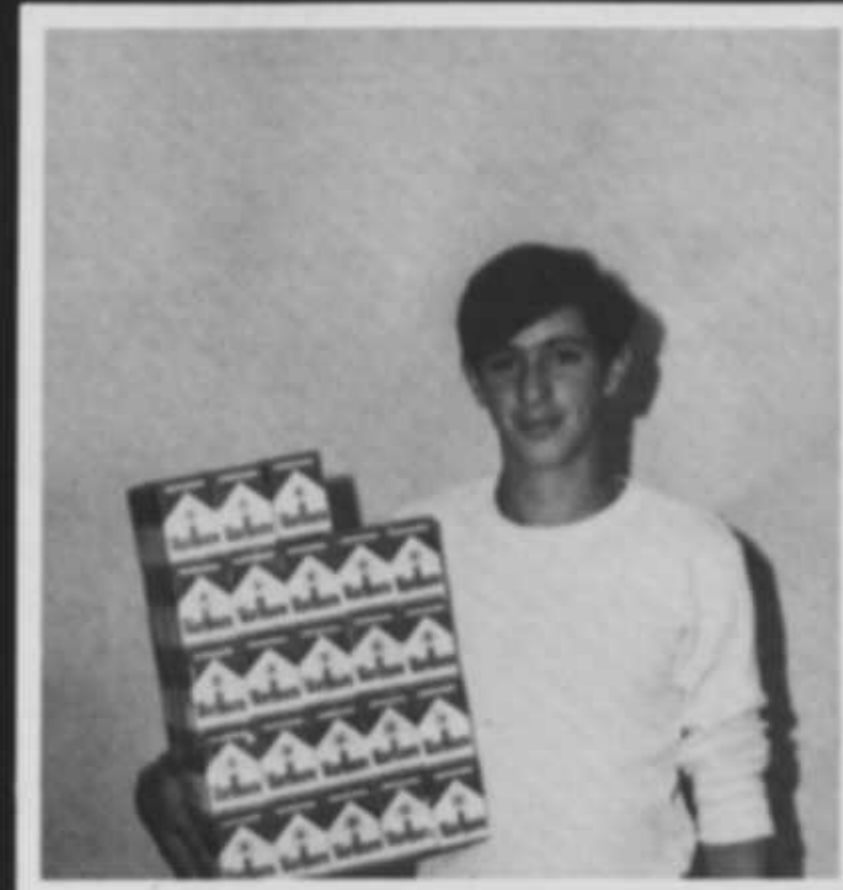

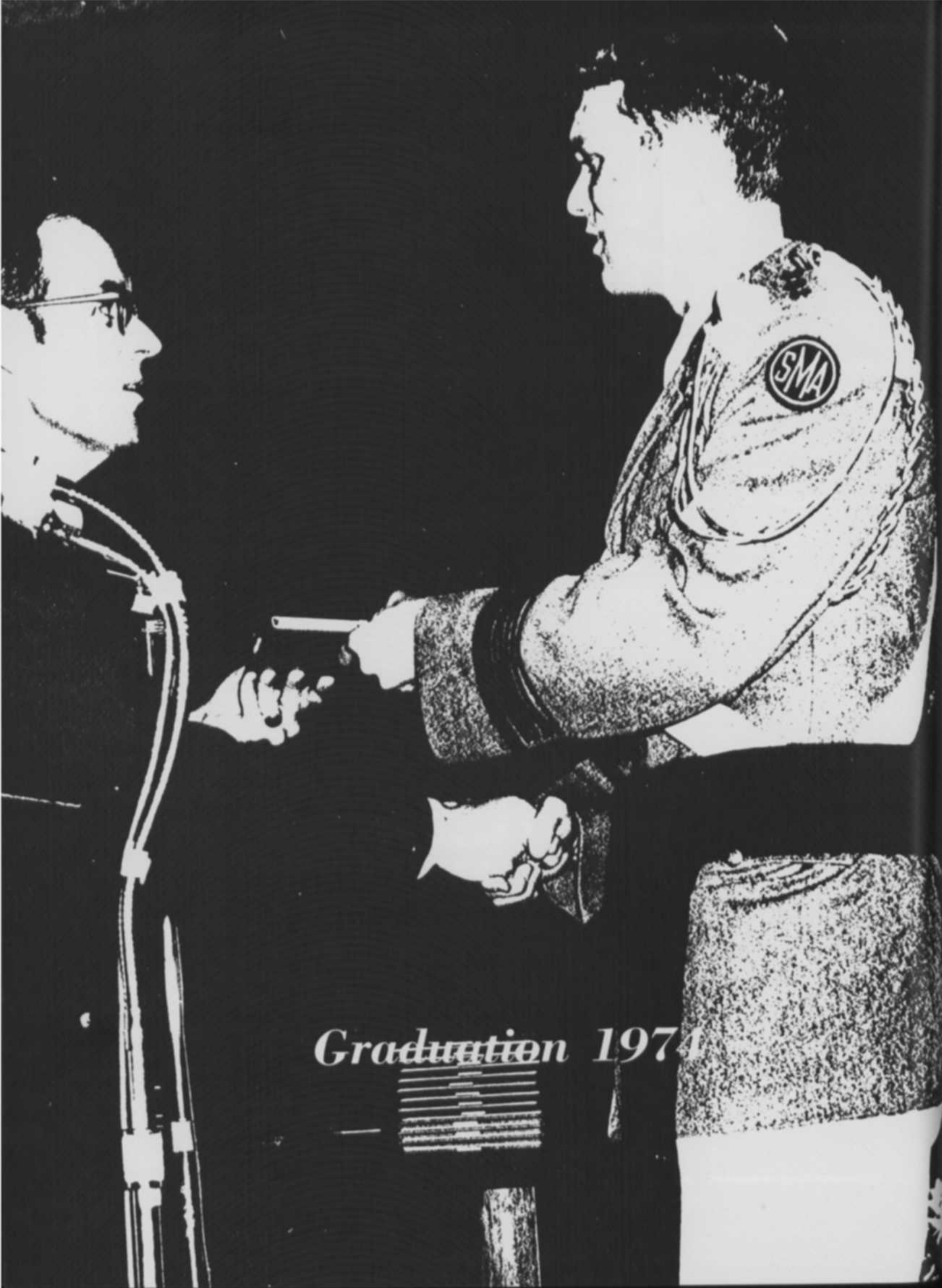
A Time Of Transition

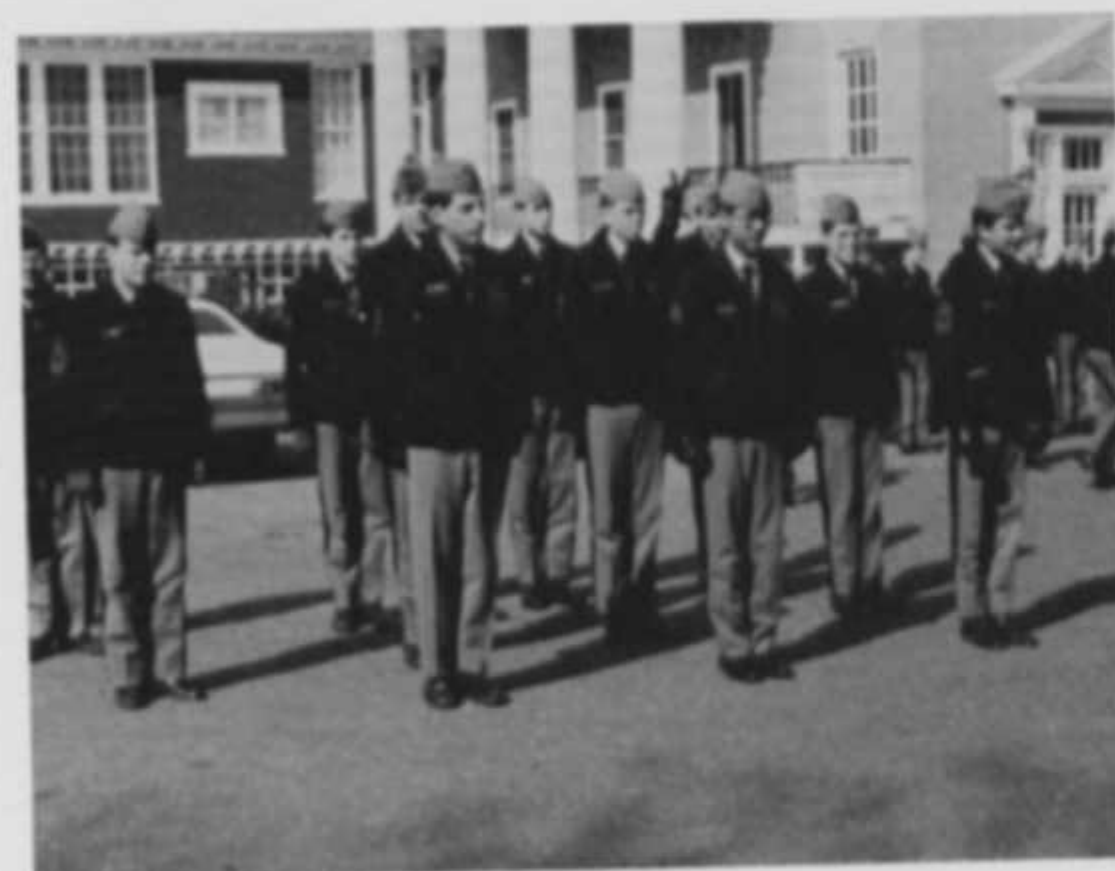

Formations



At least three times a day, sometimes four or five, the cadets are summoned to the asphalt, or front parking lot, to demonstrate how well they have learned the basic thrill of drill. Formations are held before each meal, intramurals, major sporting events, assemblies, and church.



Leave and Spare Time



The temporary freedom granted to cadets during the week is called leave. Leave times are: Friday, 5:00-10:00; Saturday, 1:00-6:00, and 6:30 to 10:00; Sunday, 12:30-6:00; and Tuesday, 2:30-6:00. Most cadets visit downtown once in awhile, but usually only if they have some money. Those who choose to remain on the hill go to the recreation room, the canteen, gym, or just sit around in their rooms listening to music or playing their guitars.

Sweep Detail



The first really organized thing that cadet learns about at S.M.A. is called sweep detail. The sergeant in charge seems to wolf his food down at mess, and run back to the barracks to run sweep detail. The moat, the quadrangles, the back of Kable Hall, and the galleries in both barracks receive a thorough onceover only to become twice as littered about an hour later.



Beat Squad



During the week, a lot of people do little things wrong. Some of them get caught at it. When they do, they join the ranks of Beat Squad. Beat Squad is held during all leave time and cadets do such fun things as: marching with a rifle, picking up trash, marching, sweeping up, marching, shoveling snow, and marching.

The Asphalt



The Asphalt is probably the most conspicuous and frequented spot on the S.M.A. campus. It could be called the heart of the Hill, except by those who on occasion help to wear out a little bit more of the surface. Formations and other social gatherings such as assemblies occur every day at this area. It is divided up among the companies, who fiercely defend their prospective sections through all types of weather. It is also one of the most dangerous areas on the hill when the snow is on the ground and the tempers are flying.

G.I. Inspection



One of the traditional events at S.M.A. is the Annual Formal inspection, conducted by the U.S. Army. The ratings given to each military school are based on: military activities such as drill and military training classes, the general appearance of the corps at parades, inspection of rooms, inspections of uniforms, and various other military aspects. The inspection itself takes place over one week-end in spring, about two weeks after spring vacation, but the preparation begins long before that. The barracks are given a full scrubbing down, and each cadet prepares diligently for the room and uniform inspection. S.M.A. has achieved the rating of Honor School with Distinction for nearly every year in which the inspections have taken place. The basic atmosphere around the barracks during preparation is one of "Spring Cleaning."
